

- Develop interventions and enhance cultural sensitivity to respond to the unique safety challenges of diverse vulnerable populations.
- Expand capacity to provide lifeskills services to survivors.
- Develop and enhance services and partnerships that empower clients to freedom.
- Strengthen high quality trauma-informed services for service providers, community partners, and survivors.



SSP & Outreach Collaboration

- More outreach and trainings in the community with a case manager present to provide support and answer questions from attendees.
- More language-specific trainings.
- Continue sharing updates between the two teams to encourage collaborationFor example: the ElderSafe training we held that led to our referral of clients.



OUTREACH AND TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Outreach Program works in the community to raise awareness of domestic violence and sexual assault. We do this by promoting healthy relationships, stressing the importance of consent, and distributing outreach materials anywhere and everywhere so people know about our services.

The **Training and Technical Assistance Program** works closely with mainstream service providers and community leaders to strengthen their ability to serve A/PI survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault. DVRP trains service providers on best practices when responding to A/PI survivors, cultural competency, DV screenings, and other trainings specific to sensitive topics in the A/PI community.
